Scheme	What it offers / key features	Availability / Status / Notes
Solent Growth Hub	A single point of access to a variety of funding and support options for businesses in the Solent area. They are also developing a long-term action plan to help local businesses recover and build resilience.	https://www.southampton.gov.uk/business- licensing/support-for-business/resources/
Let's Do Business Finance (LDBF)	Providing Start Up Loans (up to £25,000) to new businesses (under 3 years trading) across the Southeast of England, explicitly including Hampshire. Also provide Business Loans from £25,000 up to £150,000 and are accredited for the British Business Bank's Growth Guarantee Scheme. They have also been accredited for the Community ENABLE Funding programme, enabling more lending to smaller/underserved businesses in the Southeast, including Hampshire.	They are a Community Development Financial Institution and Responsible Finance Provider. https://www.letsdobusinessfinance.co.uk/
Portsmouth Match Fund	A grant for small and micro businesses that contributes 20-50% of project costs, minimum £2,000 up to £5,000. Could aid digital, product development, equipment, training, etc.	Officially launched; check whether it's open now. It's a grant rather than equity or a loan. Applications for Round 4 close at midnight on 12 th October 2025. https://www.portsmouth.gov.uk/services/business/business-support/portsmouth-match-fund/

Hampshire, UK, Sources of Funding, October 2025

Basingstoke & Deane Business Investment Fund	A fund intended to help local micro and small businesses invest in equipment, production methods or innovations to boost productivity. A mixture of capital and revenue funding.	That particular fund is currently <i>closed</i> to new applications. Therefore, availability depends on the council's cycles. (basingstoke.gov.uk)
District Council Local Business Support Schemes	Several Hampshire councils have run discrete business investment/loan funds or matched-fund loan/grant programmes. Research your local council's website to see what services and benefits they offer to businesses within their jurisdiction.	Examples: Basingstoke & Deane Business Investment Fund and Portsmouth match funding schemes are included above. East Hampshire rural/REPF capital grants. These are usually smaller, time-limited and run in rounds. As these are often intermittent, you may need to check the website regularly for updates.
Enterprise Zone (EZ³ – in Hampshire)	While it's not direct capital grants/loans, being in an Enterprise Zone can provide benefits, incentives, lower business rates/easier planning/infrastructure advantages. Enhances the attractiveness of the investment.	Examples: Basing View (Basingstoke) Whitehill & Bordon Tech Forest (East Hampshire) https://www.hants.gov.uk/business/EZ3-enterprise-zone
Havant Business Support Fund	A local fund (by a local MP plus the Solent LEP) that has provided investment to local businesses.	Currently closed; keep checking the website for updates. (Alan Mak)
